

Sustainable Carbon Management

Reducing reliance on carbon:

- Energy and resources efficiency (building, transport, industry...)
- Electrification, hydrogen, new industrial processes

Recycling carbon:

- Phase out the use of virgin fossil carbon
- Recycling carbon from waste streams, biomass or directly from atmosphere
- Circular economy, bio-economy, CCU

Removing carbon from the atmosphere:

- Reverse the process of releasing fossil and biogenic carbon to the atmosphere
- Role of ecosystems and engineered solutions
- Development and deployment at scale requires new policy support



State of Play on Policies

Climate Law:

Climate Neutral and Net Negative post 2050

• Fit-for-55:

Revision of key Climate and Energy policies, including ETS and LULUCF

Innovation Fund:

- Bringing clean tech solutions, including carbon removals, to the market
- Ongoing calls for large-scale and small-scale projects

Carbon Farming:

- Promote carbon sequestration as new business model with direct incentives
- Publication of Carbon Farming Handbook

Certification of Carbon Removals

- Regulatory framework for the certification of carbon removals
- Robust and transparent carbon accounting to monitor and verify the authenticity of carbon removals
- Step-wise development and integration of carbon removals in a EU climate policy architecture
- Long-lasting framework will require some changes to incorporate lessons while regulatory stability is also important

- Source of CO2
- Type of storage
- Maturity, scalability
- Impact on existing policies?



Certification and MRV

- Boundaries of the system, robustness
- Additionality, link with inventories
- Permanence, liability
- Differentiation

Governance

- Common rules across EU
- Which role for EU? Member States? Private actors?
- Limiting administrative burden
- Step wise approach
